

School Student Placement Policy in the Office of the Attorney General

The Attorney General is keen to promote Law as a career option as well as generating greater public interest in the law and has implemented a number of initiatives in support of these aims. Alongside these initiatives the Attorney welcomes the opportunity for school students to benefit from work experience in the Office of the Attorney General.

Each year the Attorney receives a number of requests for school student placements or work experience unfortunately the number of places offered must be limited and his policy in considering school students placements is:

- Students must be 16 years of age or over at the time of Office placement;
- Placements will be limited to a two day period;
- Priority will be given to students who have participated or are currently participating in the Attorney Generals School Living Law Programme;
- The overall limit on placements will be based on current and projected Office work demands. This may mean that a place cannot be offered in a particular school year. If a student cannot have a placement for this reason an application in any subsequent year will be given the same priority as that derived from the Living Law Programme.

- A brief reasoning of your interest in a placement in the Office of the Attorney General; and
- Proposed dates which you wish to be considered for placement.
